Organize Your Notes to Create the BodyOnce you've introduced the book with a few sentences, it's time to write the body of the summary. This is where you'll turn to your notes. If you didn't create an outline before, now is the time to do so. Organize your points in order in paragraph form. The ultimate goal is for the reader to know exactly what the book was about, even if he or she has never read it. Try putting yourself in the reader of your summary's shoes. What would you need to know to understand what the book was about? Once you've finished the body, add a conclusion that gives the reader an understanding of significance of the book. Did it teach a lesson, or was there a moral to the story? Were there themes present throughout the book? Edit and ProofreadOnce you've finished, read over your summary a few times to make sure it makes sense. Not only do you want to check for spelling and grammar errors, but you'll want to make sure the description flows from point to point and makes sense. Try reading it out loud to yourself to see how it sounds when you hear it. Read it a friend or family member to see if they can provide any feedback. Once you're certain it's complete, you can turn it in to your teacher or professor.
